

Understanding the Eucharist today



Here is another article to help you refresh, and deepen your understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist by reflecting on different parts and aspects of the Mass.

PART I—THE GATHERING


Although it contains many traditional elements and terms, the Mass shares the basic structure of any human celebration. Every celebration has four basic units: Gathering, Listening, Sharing, and Sending Forth. People gather and form a community to celebrate. They listen to one another or to a speaker to understand the meaning of the event. They share food, drink, conversation, and themselves in a variety of ways. Finally, they are dismissed and disperse, ending the event. These elements will be expressed formally or informally, but they will always be there in some form.


The Mass can be divided into two major sections, one including the Gathering and the Listening and the other composed of the Sharing and the Dismissal. The Gathering and the Listening are called the Entrance Rites and the Liturgy of the Word (sometimes together called the Liturgy of the Word). The second major part of the Mass is Eucharistic Rite and Dismissal (sometimes together called the Liturgy of the Eucharist or the Liturgy of the Table).

The Mass, then, begins with the gathering of Christians, the assembling of the People of God in this time and place. When all have arrived, the gathering is celebrated ritually with the Entrance Rites. According to the introduction to the Roman Missal the purpose of these rites is to make the assembled people a unified community and to prepare them properly to listen to God's word and to celebrate the Eucharist. In practical terms, what these rites can do is to make people more aware of the fact that there are a community and then help them to settle down and focus their attention on the Word of God proclaimed in the Readings.

The Entrance Rites include the Entrance Song, the Sign of the Cross, the Greeting, the Penitential Rite, the Glory to God and the Opening Prayer. The Mass begins with an Entrance Hymn, which is intended to serve several functions. Singing helps people get into the mood of celebration and also sense their unity, since all sing the same words at the same time and on (roughly) the same note! The Entrance Song is often chosen to suggest the theme of the Sunday or feast being celebrated. Originally developed to accompany the procession of the ministers to the altar, it still serves that function, even if the procession is often a short one in many churches today.
