### **Understanding the Eucharist today**

Here is another article to help you refresh, and deepen your understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist by reflecting on different parts and aspects of the Mass.

### PART I—THE GATHERING continued...

On Sundays (except in Advent and Lent) and major feasts, the Glory to God follows the penitential rite. This song of praise comes from Greek and Syrian sources in the very early centuries of the Church. It is modelled on the psalms and canticles of the Bible and contains much biblical material. Though it reminds us of the angels' Christmas greeting to the shepherds, it was originally an Easter hymn. It then found a place at the end of morning prayer in the East, and by the sixth century found its way into the Roman Mass. Originally sung by the whole assembly, it later became a choir piece with a very elaborate melody. The recent renewal of the liturgy has returned this ancient hymn to the whole assembly as its song of praise.

The oldest and most important part of the Entrance Rites is the Opening Prayer. In the earliest centuries, the Mass began with just a period of silent prayer before the reading of the Word of God. Then a short collect prayer was added for the priest to 'collect' the prayers of the assembly in verbal form. (This is how we still begin on Good Friday). All the rest of the entrance rites were added later. The function of this prayer is the same as it was in the beginning: to sum up the silent prayers of the assembly. That's why it is usually rather general in its wording. That's also why there is a silent space between the invitation to 'Let us pray' and the collect itself. This silent time is intended to give all who are at Mass the chance to express to the Lord their personal prayers for the day.

The Opening Prayer brings us to the end of the Entrance Rites. If they have succeeded in their purpose, we are now conscious of our identity as the Body of Christ and ready to hear the Word of God. Many authors have suggested that the Entrance Rites today are too long and too cluttered. The addition of so many different elements over the centuries has produced a fairly lengthy beginning, and it is possible that it will be simplified in the years ahead. Whether long or short, however, these rites will only be effective as we allow them to be for us. Our own personal willingness to enter into the dynamics and the spirit of the liturgy of the day is the most important element in the success or failure of these rites.
