Understanding the Eucharist today

Here is another article to help you refresh, and deepen your understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist by reflecting on different parts and aspects of the Mass.

Part II— The Listening....continued

Several minor rituals remaining in the current Preparation Rite call for a bit of explanation. When the chalice (cup) is prepared, a bit of water is mixed with the wine. It was the custom in ancient times, in religious rites and ordinary usage, to dilute the wine with water to make it less strong. Early Christians continued this custom in the Eucharist. This very practical action, however, soon was given symbolic meaning. In the West, it came to represent the union of Christ with the faithful; just as the wine receives the water, so Christ takes us into himself and we are one with him. In the East, the interpretation saw the wine and water as representing the divine and human nature of Christ. Just as one cannot separate the water and the wine, so Jesus is fully human and fully divine at one and the same time. In our current rite, the silent prayer that accompanies this ritual gesture combines both interpretations: "By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the divinity of Christ, who humbled himself to share in our humanity."

After the bread and cup are prepared, the priest washes his hands. Like the mixing of the water and wine, this may have originally been a practical action, following the presentation of the gifts when those gifts included various foods for the poor, etc. But washing hands as a sign of inner purity was customary both in Judaism and in early Christianity. It remains in the liturgy today as a reminder of our need to be cleansed from sin if we are to worship well. The silent prayer that accompanies this rite says: "Lord, wash away my iniquities and cleanse me from my sins," a quote from Psalm 51:2.
