Understanding the Eucharist today

Here is another article to help you refresh, and deepen your understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist by reflecting on different parts and aspects of the Mass.


After prayers for the living and the dead, the Eucharistic Prayer includes a remembrance of the saints and prays that we might share with them in the glory of Christ. Then the prayer concludes with the Final Doxology and the Great Amen. The word 'Amen' is a short but important response to all that has been proclaimed. Many people translate 'Amen' as 'So be it', which is not a bad translation. Yet the word means a lot more than that phrase seems to convey. Scholars tell us that the root word in Hebrew from which Amen is derived means 'to pound in one's tent stake'. Now that may not sound too impressive until you remember that the people who used that root word were desert nomads. In the desert, one does not survive long without a tent for protection from the heat of the day and the cold of the desert night. Thus 'to stake one's tent' comes close to our expression, 'I'd stake my life on it' That's really the meaning of 'Amen'. It is a word that expresses commitment and agreement. 'So be it in my life as I have just heard'. Thus, our 'Amen' at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer signifies our acceptance of Jesus' way of life as our own, including his death and resurrection. One might well hesitate to say 'Amen'. For such a short word it carries a lot of meaning and demands much of those who say it.
