Scripture and Morality: Living Life to the Full According to God's Word

The Catholic Church's teachings on morality suggest that God wants us to lead a life that is good. But what does a 'good life' look like and what role has Scripture played in the development of this teaching? This course focuses on the changing role of Scripture in the moral teaching of the Church and explores how moral thinking developed in the early Church. Using passages such as The Sermon on the Mount and Jesus' Great Commandment of loving one's neighbour as oneself, we will explore how relevant and urgent these teachings are in our changing world today.

Understanding the Eucharist today

Here is another article to help you refresh, and deepen your understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist by reflecting on different parts and aspects of the Mass.

The Dismissal Rites of the Eucharist, like most leave-takings, are short and to the point. Originally the dismissal was simply a word to go forth, sometimes preceded by a blessing. It now includes the announcements, a greeting and blessing of the people, a formula of dismissal, the veneration of the altar, and the recessional hymn. Any necessary announcements are placed at the end of the Mass, since they concern the ways that we carry out our mission as Christians after the Mass has ended. The whole dismissal rite is a rite of sending forth, a rite that commissions us to go forth to live the mystery we have celebrated in the Eucharist. The announcements remind us of various ways the community will seek to live the Gospel during the coming week. The blessing of the people is an ancient element of leave-taking. Fathers blessed their children when they left the house or went on a journey. Teachers blessed their students at the end of their lessons. And religious leaders blessed their congregations before they departed, asking God's care and guidance for them as they went forth to live their faith. The blessings used at Mass focus on a variety of God's gifts, often related to the day's theme.
